In this unit, you will learn about various things in life.

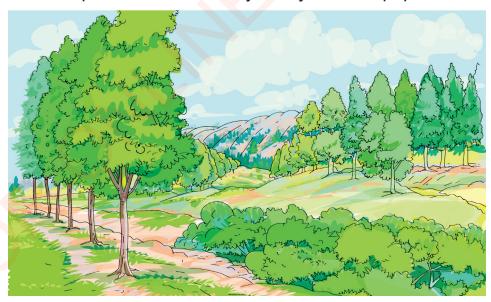
Activity 1: Reading

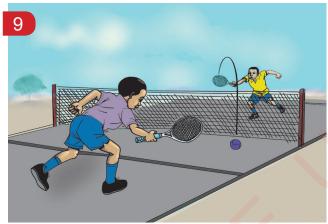
